What happened in the few weeks since the last publication mid February?

A short informal Regional Meeting will be held on Friday morning at conference. Those MAs wishing to inform the audience on problems, investigations, developments and more, shall please prepare a short note (or report). I urge those who have re-

cently encountered major problems to use this feature to give an update to their colleagues and delegates at the meeting.

LUXEMBOURG

Following the runway incursion at Luxembourg airport, our member association asked the Executive Board for assistance, which we provided in form of a letter to the Luxembourg government. This letter led to an invitation by the Minister of Transport to discuss the accident and follow up actions. PCX, our Human Factors Expert Bert Ruitenberg and EVP EUR met in Luxembourg on Thursday 25th March. The meeting was well received by our colleagues. We explained our concerns and outlined a possible approach to overcome the difficulties associated with the accident. The minister and his staff listened to our explanations address the systemic issues rather than looking at the symp-

ICELAND

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Our colleagues in Iceland called for strike action (4 hours per day affecting all domestic and in-/outbound flights; overflights were not involved) following a

deadlocked situation in their negotiations for a new collective agreement.

Member associations in need of financial support to attend the 49th Annual Conference can address EVP EUR or the office in Montreal. IFATCA upon request will financially support an MA being unable to send a delegate to conference. Additionally the ESF (European Support Fund) is available to all European MAs.

A main item of the dispute are adjustments in the cost of living factor, which were agreed to be paid to some aviation professionals (pilots), but not to the air traffic controllers.

As the Executive Board felt this being more of a union matter, it was decided to submit a letter of general support with the plea to continue negotiations in order to find an acceptable solution to all parties involved.

BELGIUM

The ongoing "battle" of our Belgian colleagues entered another round.

After IFATCAs intervention last autumn, an audit had been ordered by the government to investigate the Belgian ANSP BELGOCONTROL. The findings of this audit were published last week. BELGOCONTROL management denied to accept the audit, which in turn forced our colleagues to call for industrial actions (commencing 23rd March), which have - according to latest news - been postponed for ten days. As this dispute has moved on to a political stage, it unfortunately leaves the scope of the professional involvement of IFATCA.

We carefully monitor the development and will assist where we can.
